Food & Ag Bills

HB 1070	revise certain fees pertaining to seed permits and nursery certificates of inspection.
HB 1076	authorize the Board of Regents to replace certain real estate held for agriculture field laboratory research purposes, to make improvements to the replacement lands, and to make an appropriation for such purposes.
HB 1078	prohibit acts of terrorism against persons engaged in a state university activity involving live animals.
HB 1126	revise certain provisions regarding a private applicator of pesticides becoming a qualified driver for the purpose of motor carrier safety.
HB 1146	prohibit the torture of animals and to provide certain penalties therefor.
HB 1147	extend civil immunity to licensed veterinarians in certain circumstances.
HB 1167	revise the statute of frauds with respect to the sale of grain, grain sorghums, beans, and oilseeds.
HB 1173	appropriate money for the Northern Crops Institute.
HB 1181	establish a veterinary education loan repayment program for veterinarians who fulfill certain requirements.
HB 1224	place certain restrictions on state participation in a national animal identification system.
HB 1294	repeal the methodology that assesses agricultural land based on its agricultural income value, to dissolve the implementation and oversight advisory task force, and to revise certain provisions concerning the assessment of real property.
SB 3	revise certain provisions concerning the assessment of agricultural land.
SB 44	repeal certain sales and use tax exemptions concerning the sale of feed for certain animals and the sale of certain animals, and to repeal the classification of fur-bearing animals.
SB 53	modify the type of financial documents required for a grain buyer's license and to declare an emergency.
SB 54	revise how certain rates are determined for grain warehouse operators.
SB 55	revise the requirements regarding the licensing and regulation of grain buyers.
SB 135	revise certain statutes relating to the granting of certain licenses by the Animal Industry Board.
SB 182	repeal the methodology that assesses agricultural land based on its agricultural income value, to dissolve the implementation and oversight advisory task force, and to revise certain provisions concerning the assessment of real property.

Human Health

HB 1029	modify the requirements for a filing of a consent to rate for property casualty insurance.
HB 1041	provide physicians with a limited permit to practice medicine within a residency program and to revise certain provisions regarding the Board of Examiners authority to administer resident

	certificates and resident training permits.
HB 1042	permit an extension to the required examination time period allowed for certain medical licensing examinations.
HB 1043	make an appropriation to reimburse certain family physicians and dentists who have complied with the requirements of the physician tuition reimbursement program or the dental tuition reimbursement program.
HB 1049	revise certain provisions regarding captive insurance companies.
HB 1092	regulate the practice of genetic counseling and to prohibit the practice of genetic counseling without a license.
SB 28	repeal certain provisions regarding the coordination of benefits and the rescission of individual health insurance.
SB 29	revise the requirements for replacement or discontinuance of group life insurance policies.
SB 36	revise certain drug registration fees and license fees related to health care facilities.
SB 85	clarify certain rules of evidence to determine the value of services for which special damages may be awarded in health care malpractice cases.
SB 195	repeal the ban on certain medical research and to provide certain limitations for human embryonic stem cell research.

Industrial & Environmental

HB 1299	require the state-owned fuel terminals and facilities to supply certain ethanol blends.
SB 16	revise certain provisions regarding the taxation of biodiesel and biodiesel blends.
SB 21	impose a fuel excise tax on ethyl alcohol and methyl alcohol used in motor vehicles on the public roads and highways, to repeal the fuel excise tax on ethanol blends and E85 and M85, and to revise certain provisions regarding the fuel excise tax.
SB 31	revise certain labeling requirements for gasoline or gasoline blends.
SB 57	allow the use of energy efficiency and conservation to count toward the state's renewable and recycled energy objective.
SB 59	revise certain provisions regarding the amount of the filing fee for the siting of energy facilities.
SB 93	provide for the establishment of rural community-based energy development projects.
SB 120	encourage energy conservation and efficiency by establishing certain procedures regarding the reporting, sale, and marketing of renewable energy and recycled energy certificates.
SB 194	increase revenues for state and local highways by increasing the fuel excise tax on certain ethanol blends.
SB 200	provide for a tax on the wholesale price of certain fuel and to increase the fuel excise tax.

Other

HB 1022	make certain members of limited liability companies and partners of partnerships personally responsible for certain tax debts.

HB 1027	provide for certain employer insurance assistance programs.
HB 1072	repeal certain provisions concerning the delayed remittance of sales and use taxes for certain businesses.
HB 1077	make an appropriation to the Board of Regents to improve South Dakota's research capacity and to promote and coordinate educator and student engagement in the educational and research opportunities at the Sanford Underground Science and Engineering Laboratory.
HB 1183	authorize the Board of Regents and the South Dakota Building Authority to contract for construction of the Higher Education Center-West River, to fund certain postsecondary education grant programs, and to make an appropriation therefor.
HB 1185	revise the General Appropriations Act for fiscal year 2009.
HB 1298	require the Board of Regents to prepare a plan to close one of the postsecondary educational institutions under its control.
SB 43	repeal the sales and use tax exemptions for certain amateur sports officials and rodeo services.
SB 67	make an appropriation to the Board of Regents to support the research, education, and economic development network.
SB 68	authorize the establishment, operation, and control of research parks on state land.
